Marcus Dupree, 1982 Highlights

<u>Texas</u> - 67 yard fake end around after Texas had just tried the same play and failed. First the broadcast. Then contrast and compare Fred Akers and Barry Switzer's version of the same play.

Kansas - 75 yards with a stiff arm. Bud Wilkinson is the color commentator. Then Barry Switzer adds "Bye bye big boy" and "Get out of my way boy."

Oklahoma State - The 1982 OU Wishbone at it's finest. Marcus takes the pitch and watch the blocking develop. First block is by Stanley Wilson. Barry Switzer narrates.

<u>Colorado</u> - 77 yard punt return. "The biggest punt returner in the nation" says Barry Switzer. The Colorado guy puts a clothesline on Mr. Dupree with no effect.

<u>Kansas State</u> - 80 yard touchdown run. Key blocks by Stanley Wilson and Steve "Dr. Death" WIlliams.

<u>Missouri</u> - 70 yard touchdown run. Mr. Dupree flattens the safety and outruns the rest. His stride is less than two per yard stripe.

Nebraska - 86 yard touchdown run on third and 13 against the #1 Cornhuskers. "He's to the 20, he may go." HIs first, Marquez Dupree, was born the next week.

Arizona State in Fiesta Bowl - Fiesta Bowl record 239 yards on 17 carries, a bit over 14 per carry. Notice that Mr. Dupree weighed about 20 pounds more than he did in the Nebraska game. That's what Momma's cooking will do. Switzer always said he could have run for 500 and he would have too. Jim Jeffcoat plays for ASU. His son Jackson is the subject of an intense recruiting battle between Texas and OU.
